

Trident University International has introduced Challenge Exams for undergraduate students in select subjects, including

PSYCHOLOGY, SOCIOLOGY, BIOLOGY, ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY, COMPUTER HARDWARE, U.S. HISTORY, MICROECONOMICS, AND MACROECONOMICS.

Successful completion of an exam will provide a student with proficiency credit that they can apply towards an undergraduate degree. These examinations test students on similar outcomes and objectives taught in the respective Trident courses.

Exams are available at no additional cost, and there is no penalty if a student does not pass. Trident is planning to add more challenge exams in the future.

Earn Credit

To earn credit on a Challenge Exam, a student must earn at least 60% or better. Students who pass an exam will have proficiency credit added to their respective degree plan, and the course will be removed from their schedule.

Eligibility

Exams are only available to students currently enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. Students cannot have previously attempted the course and cannot have transfer credit for the course. For full eligibility requirements, please visit: www.trident.edu/pla.
